## Public Safety Fence at MARTA Station

After several months of negotiation between CPNO and MARTA officials, a tentative agreement has been reached to seal off the entrance and exit points at the North end of the Candler Park MARTA Station. Both the Candler Park Drive entrance and the Iverson Park entrance are frequently used by criminal elements committing numerous acts of vandalism, robbery, drug dealing, car theft, etc. in the area of Candler Park closest to the MARTA Station property. Statistics collected over the last year have shown that a high percentage of neighborhood crime occurs specifically in this area.

The 4 foot fence currently dividing Iverson Park from the MARTA parking lot is useless and ignored by criminals who cruise the poorly lit park at night as a drug dealing and using hangout. Hundreds of empty "crack" cocaine bags have been collected there over the past six months. Candler Park Drive also provides a convenient linkage between our neighborhood and the large unsupervised MARTA parking lot it dead ends into. Police have repeatedly complained that their vehicles are blocked at the dead end while criminals simply hop over or walk through the barricade.

A representative of MARTA will be on hand at the December neighborhood meeting to answer any questions concerning the proposed fence.

## End of Year Status Report

The year has nearly come to a close and it's time to review this year's successes. We end the year on a bright financial note with nearly \$3500 in the CPNO account. This represents a small increase over last year's ending balance. CPNO spent nearly \$7000 and raised around \$7200. Some of the expenditures included the following:

Big money makers (net income) this year included the CPNO Messenger - \$1000, the Annual Yard Sale - \$957.49, and the Annual Tour of Homes - \$1012.63.

Other activities that CPNO accomplished this year include the Candler Park Plan of Improvement, the Dekalb Corridor Study, the new hex-pattern sidewalk ordinance, and the re-establishment of the Crime-Watch/block captain system. 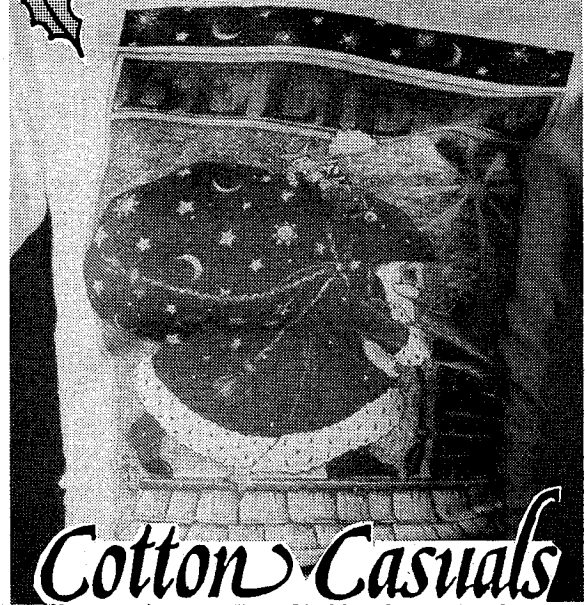

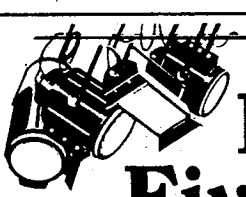

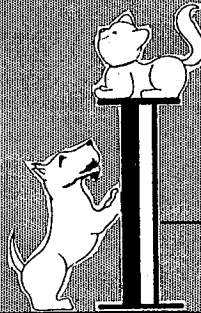
