CPNO Annual Sponsorship

CPNO spends many volunteer hours working on issues and events in Candler Park which require funding for support. Previous funding from yard sale, T-shirt and "Tour of Home" sales have been insufficient and unpredictable making planning and commitments difficult. Issues like CAUTION, recycling, and CrimeWatch all need financial support in order to succeed. The question is "How best do we support these functions?"

After careful thought by many persons throughout Candler Park, the recommended solution is a community sponsorship program. (Currently done in many other neighborhoods.) Making a set, annual contribution, hopefully a tax deductible one soon, to CPNO for services will improve the budgeting and planning process. The Candler Park Community Sponsorship fee is \$20 per year, per household. Contributions cover some of the following Expenses :

- Curbside pickup (current cost is \$12 per year) of recyclable materials for the year;
- refreshments at every meeting;
- support for the Messenger;
- materials for CrimeWatch;
- donations to CAUTION;
- utilities and storage fees;
- annual directory insert;
- festivals and picnics;
- beautification projects in the park;
- entrance signs for Candler Park.

Please! We need your financial help. Return the enclosed CPNO Community Sponsorship coupon on the back to support your CPNO. Remember that \$12 of your sponsorship will go toward your household's annual recycling fee.

Recycling Revamp

The recycling program takes an organized step forward to solve the recyclable collection problem, to benefit the neighborhood, and to be kind to mother earth. A contract is being prepared to pay a recycling contractor to pick up recyclables throughout Candler Park. The financial incentive will help keep the program organized and make the contractor responsive to any suggestions or problems with the collection. Payment to the contractor is through CPNO Community Sponsorship which will provide financial and administrative control for the recycling program. The contractor will only pick up recycle materials from Community Sponsors. The recycling bins behind Sevenanda are available for those who do not wish to participate in the program but still want to recycle.

CrimeWatch Protects You!!

It's a new year and time for some resolutions. CPNO is hoping that you put participation in our CrimeWatch program high on your list of priorities. What's in it for you? 1. a greater sense of community; 2. enhancement of personal safety; 3. information on what's happening; 4. moral support; 5. a chance to voice your ideas and opinions; and 6. a potential for lowering our crime rate.

If there are any of you out there who don't know about our

CrimeWatch program, it is an organized agreement among neighbors for their collective security. Responsibilities include calling one another and the police whenever suspicious activity is observed, maintaining a written list of all your block's phone numbers and street addresses, and developing a plan of action to deal with criminal activity in progress.

We would particularly like to have our senior citizens and our new residents get involved. If you don't know who your Block Captain is, or if you are interested in becoming a block captain for your street, please contact Anita Teel at 523-8200.

Auto Theft Memo- CPNO is attempting to keep better track of auto theft and auto vandalism in our neighborhood. Start Recycling Today!

"Well, I'd do it but I just don't have the space. And, I'm really in a hurry. I don't use much of that stuff anyway. Maybe I'll look into it sometime."

This is sometime. An once you get started, you'll be surprised how much emptier your "city" garbage can will be.

"It" is recycling. First question; where do you put it? Even the smallest home has a closet corner

for boxes. This may be the perfect excuse for parting with your Aunt Edna's old clothes, even if you still believe it may all be back in style some day.

Do you have a utility or laundry closet? Install a shelf above the washer and dryer. Is the space under your kitchen sink currently filled with partial bottles of dish soap and Drano? Consolidate them, dump them or use them up and you've found more space. And while you're at it, check to be sure you're using biodegradable soap with no phosphates.

Containers. Anything from a sturdy cardboard box to the official Home Depot stackable, flip-top recycle bins will work fine. Sevenanda always has plenty of the heavy cardboard boxes from the gallons of spring water they sell. The boxes even have handholds in the sides and a spot for writing "CLEAR GLASS" or "CANS", etc. Target sells a small "laundry" basket for under \$3.

It may take a couple of weeks to get in the habit, but once you've got the hang of it, you will automatically put that container in the sink with your dishes instead of tossing it in the garbage can. Then, while rinsing the plates, you'll swish the container out with a little water, thereby avoiding penicillin growth before your monthly curbside or drop-off day. Before you know it, like a reformed smoker, you'll be telling your friends, "Its easy. You really should do it. It's a small planet you know."

Recyclables include:

Glass - bottles and jars, no lids, rinsed and sorted by color.

Aluminum - aluminum beverage cans.

Newspapers - tied with twine or in paper sacks. No junk mail, magazines, phone books. (Look for specific drops when new phone books come out.)

Plastics - rinsed, currently accepted at Dekalb Farmer's Market

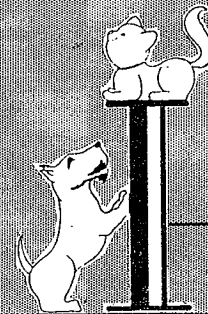
