The April meeting had many special guests present including State Senator Cathy Steinburg, Jim Watkins from Ben Jone's office, Atlanta Chief of Police Eldrin Bell (a resident of Candler Park), Zone 6 Captain E.S. Moore, Karen Huebner, Director of the Atlanta Urban Design Commission, Anne Farrisee, Director of the Atlanta Preservation Center, and Walter Brown, NPU "N" Chair. It was very gratifying to have the participation and suggestions from everyone in attendance. The presence of the guests demonstrates that our voices are heard by government when we speak up.

While unable to attend the April meeting, there is a lot of communication with Councilmember Mary Davis. She quickly responds to inquiries and sends responses and pertinent information about issues which affect Candler Park.

## **Historic Perserverance**

Thanks to all those who returned their survey forms or attended the April meeting about Historic Preservation. Many ideas and concerns were covered to help define the level of preservation control desired by the neighborhood. The direction at this time seems to be primarily to protect Candler Park from uncontrolled commercial and residential development on vacant lands (e.g. pre-sidential parkway land), to prevent unnecessary demolition of structurally sound houses, to re-enforce current historic protection (which expires this June), and to conform with current zoning regulations.

## **Big Trash Day Planned**

David Speed has organized the annual "Big" Trash pickup in Candler Park for the first week of June. This is the time to cleanup and throw out all the trash and junk you don't know what to do with ('cause it isn't even fit for the Candler Park Yard Sale). On June 1st and 2nd, place all your large trash items on the curb in front of your house. From June 3rd through the 7th, the City will collect this trash.

The throw-away rules include: no rocks or bricks, no car batteries, and no contractor generated

materials. All small and loose items should be placed in boxes or containers or tied up. All items must be on the curb and be easily visible from the street. Please keep the roadways safe from protruding debris.

May is National Bicycle Month, and May 21st is Bike-To-Work-Day in Atlanta. ## CrimeWatch Report

Is crime up already in Candler Park with the approach of summer? Already one rape was reported in April and an assault that may have been an attempted rape. When you are out, please be alert to your surroundings. Look around before you leave your car. If you think you are being followed, seek help immediately (screaming does work if help isn't nearby). Report any suspicious activity to the police. (You must call 911 to report crime) The suspect in the reported rape case is a black male, 5'8", 170 lbs and around 26 years of age.

After laying low in January, criminals were active in February and March. 5 auto larcenies were reported in March as were 1 attempted burglary, 6 larcenies, 8 burglaries, and 2 robberies. Please prepare yourselves for the inevitable increase in crime this spring and summer by keeping all doors and windows locked at all times, by reporting all suspicious activities, and by staying in touch with your neighbors.

The Greater Little Five Points Community Study is well under way. 
