Homestead Exemption

Attention homeowners who have joined the neighborhood in the last year.

Now that the new year is upon us, it's time to apply for your homestead exemption from your property taxes. You may have discussed this at the closing table with your Realtor, when you bought your home.

Since Candler Park falls both in the City of Atlanta, and DeKalb County you must apply for the homestead exemption in two places. You can apply for your City of Atlanta exemption at 141 Pryor St., Suite 1113 between now and April 1. You will also need to go to the Callaway Building, 120 West Trinity Place, Decatur, Room 110 between now and March 1, to apply for your DeKalb County exemption. Bring a copy of your recorded warranty deed with you to both locations.

The one component that makes this happen is YOU. CPNO needs you to:

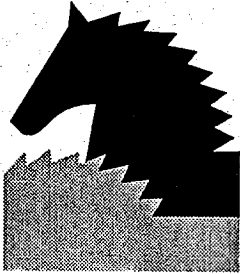
1. Educate yourself on the issues. (Read the CPNO Messenger, BOND Community Star, the local papers, and talk to your neighbors.)
