New Recycling Program

In response to dissatisfaction with the current vendor's performance, the CPNO recycling committee has decided not to renew our current recycling program, but to change to a new system. If you are a member of the current program your last curbside pickup will be on Monday, March 23.

We have a new agreement with *Waste Management* to provide provide curbside recycling to any Candler Park household, but you will have to sign up individually for it. **Please use the enclosed flyer to sign up for the new program.** Please consider this program both for renewal and also if you have not had curbside service in the past. Please act immediately so *Waste Management* can start your service in April.

The recycling committee is excited about this new program and hope that many will participate. *Waste Management* is currently providing very reliable curbside service for the city's pilot program

Details of the New Recycling Program:

Weekly pickup every Tuesday.

Includes : Newspaper, Glass, Tin and Aluminum Cans, Plastic containers and milk jugs.

Does Not Include: Paper other than newspaper (details on a possible supplemental pickup later)

No sorting: A \$4.00 deposit is required for an 18 Gallon bin for all recyclables.

Cost: \$3.50 per month for pickup every week. Pay for three months in advance (\$10.50 + bin deposit)

According to the city's sanitation department, the city will not be expanding the city recycling program this year. Please keep expressing your interest in city-organized recycling to Mary Davis, the other At Large

If the budget is passed as currently written, the CPGC will be funded for another year, this time under much closer supervision. The course will be properly maintained and course employees will actually have to work in order to be paid. You can help the neighborhood with the sale by donating items to be sold. It's a great time to clean out a closet or two and get rid of some clutter. Donations will be accepted on THURSDAY, APRIL 10 from 6:00 - 9:00 p.m. at the Epworth Methodist Church.

Items for the sale may include typical yard sale items such as dishes and other kitchen items, furniture, linens, jewelry, shoes, toys, appliances, and clothes (please only donate clothes which are clean, in good

Spring Clean-Up

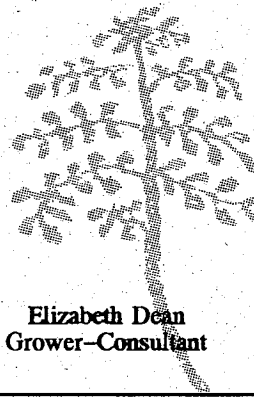
The city's Sanitation Department will service Candler Park with a neighborhood clean-up during the week of April 13 to April 17. All items to be picked up should be placed on the curb on the night of Sunday, April 12, as each street will be serviced only once during the following week. A standard garbage pick-up will be followed by heavy lift-up equipment and finally a street sweeper.

At the city's request, please put as much of your trash as possible in bags and boxes. The city will pick up just about anything, including yard waste, broken appliances and unusable furniture. They will also take most demolition waste from do-it-yourself construction projects, except for concrete and roofing. They do not take any waste resulting from a contractor's services.

We have scheduled the clean-up to follow the neighborhood yard sale which takes place on April 11. This will give you an excellent opportunity to clean out your closets, attics, and sheds and sort the material into yard sale items and trash.

As anything the city picks up will go into landfills, please donate all items of marginal usability to the yard sale. Remember, "One Man's trash is another man's treasure." The CPNO is interested in furniture, clothing, household items, toys and free standing (not built-in) appliances.

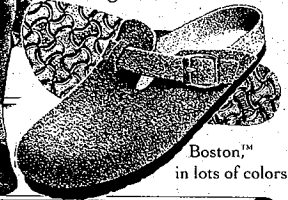
