Speaking of Which . . . The Funky Tour

On the Lake Claire Tour of Funky Homes and Gardens, Sunday, May 17, eight passive solar homes will be on view from 12 noon to 6pm. Four new homes and four "retrofits" demonstrate direct gain

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sunspaces, thermal mass, natural cooling, solar water heating, wood heat, and energy efficient, space saving construction, as well as each owner's personal and creative outlook on intown living. This self-directed walking tour also includes the Lake Claire Community Land Trust, with gardens, a handbuilt sweat lodge, and sculptures along the winding paths; the historic Cator Woolford Gardens; a creekside nature trail through a wooded ravine; and a visit to the Clifton Presbyterian Night Hospitality.

Lake Claire is our immediate neighbor to the East, and this tour is the only home tour to benefit the homeless — proceeds will be donated to Clifton Presbyterian Night Hospitality, a ministry for the homeless, to the Lake Claire Neighborhood Watch, and to the Lake Claire neighborhood association.

Tickets for the Lake Claire Tour of Funky Homes and Gardens are \$7.00 and may be purchased on tour day at the booth at the Clifton Presbyterian Church Parking lot, 369 Connecticut, at McLendon. All homes and Gardens are within a healthy walking distance. Maps are available with the ticket

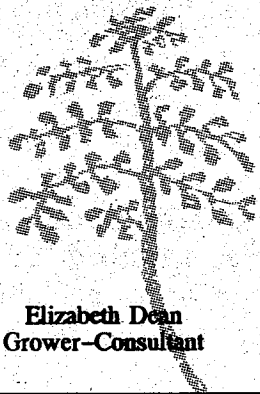


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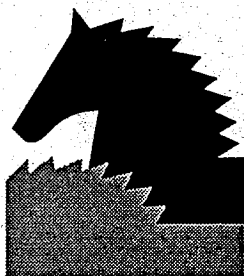
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
