MONTHLY REPORT OF THE CANDLER PARK NEIGHBORHOOD ORGANIZATION

From the President

Now that the mayor has signed the ordinance declaring the Presidential Parkway dead, for now and for always, east of Moreland Avenue, it's time for us to get serious about planning for redevelopment of the former right of way.

In its last issue The Bond Community Star published a number of creative redevelopment proposals. It is important to note that none of them have been endorsed by the CPNO or the CPNO executive committee.

What we do have, in Candler Park, is the groundwork for planning that we laid last fall and winter in our preliminary planning sessions, and more particularly, with our survey results. Though it may seem that there is still a lot of controversy about the land use, I really think that we have more that we agree upon than disagree, and, it is with the areas of agreement that I would like us to begin planning.

Based upon the results of the survey that we took last winter, the following are some basic assumptions that we seem to agree upon concerning the land:

- A large part of the land will be devoted to parks and open space.
- The parkland will be designed in such a way as to promote safety and pedestrianism.
- The parkland will have jogging trails and bicycle paths, will tie in with the Olmstead Parks along South Ponce De Leon to Moreland, and will be largely open space.
- Where parts of developed lots were taken for the right of way, the land should be restored to the original lots.
- Where new housing is developed, lot sizes and

Killer Sidewalks

Candler Parks sidewalks aren't meant to be an obstacle course, but in some areas that's exactly what they've become. If your sidewalk is in disrepair and someone injures themselves you are open to lawsuits, fines and even criminal action. For this reason it is important that you cut back plants growing on and over your sidewalk, and keep the walk in good condition and clear of debris. This includes rental property, both landlords and their tenants can be held liable for damages and injuries on property they own or occupy.

If you own and occupy your home and have a qualifying household income level, The City of Atlanta has a grant program that will cover the costs of certain types of sidewalk repairs, including laying

hexagonal pattern seen throughout the neighborhood.

Applicants can "prequalify" for the grant in advance of having the work done or the grant can be applied for if you've already paid for repairs to be done by the city. In order to qualify for the sidewalk repair grant, applicants must meet the following income requirements.

Family Size	Maximum Gross Annual / Monthly/ Weekly Income
1	\$23,250 / \$1,937.50 / \$417.12
2	\$25,550 / \$2,129.17 / \$491.35
3	\$29,900 / \$2,491.67 / \$575.00
4	\$33,200 / \$2,766.67 / \$638.47
5	\$35,300 / \$2,941.67 / \$678.85

The June Meeting of the CPNO was held on Tuesday, June 9th. The formal meeting was preceded by a pot luck supper which was enjoyed by all. Thanks to all who participated.

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 by President Maya Hahn. Don Bender reported on the Little Five Points Planning Study which has been completed and was presented to City Hall at 6:00 on June 23rd. In appreciation for a fine job, a motion was made and carried to donate \$200.00 to the Planning Committee to help offset the price of generating the report.

A presentation was made on the planned addition to the Mary Lin Elementary School. This is a product

of the COPS program which intends to move all classroom facilities in the city school system out of portable classrooms and trailers, into a series of planned additions and improvements. A music room, an art room a multi-purpose / gymnasium and some general classrooms are included in the renderings for Lin. Some of the design elements are not yet complete. Construction should begin sometime in the late fall of 1992. Care was taken not to disturb the wildlife habitat or the soccer field.

• Michael Bishop was elected to fill the vacant V.P. of Zoning position.

• Valerie gave an extensive Golf Course Update including the following highlights:

• Among the remaining issues to be resolved is the tree planting which the city is attempting on the fairways and the facts that the true costs of the operation are still not isolated. Revenues are up, however, and the incomplete information seems to indicate that a profit is present.

• Mike Bishop and Robert Craig gave an update on Historic Preservation which continues to meet. More specific information will be available when Robert's student hands in his computer work for the end of the term.

• Dagmar Epstein reported on efforts to move toward attaining Special Public Interest Zoning status with the city. Druid Hills and Inman Park are some of our neighbors who have this designation. The SPI helps set basic guidelines for future construction within the area. Such things as setbacks, lot sizes and general appearance are addressed by specifying what is acceptable. This assures compatibility of new construction with existing structures. If you are interested in joining the people who are involved in this process, please call Dagmar at 577-0370.

• The proposed city intervention of the City in the way resident artists are allowed to conduct business out of their homes has passed the first stages of approval. If you have strong

feelings regarding these restrictions, please contact the City Council before the vote scheduled for July 6th.

• Becky Battle, our CAUTION representative, informed us that recent literature circulated by Judy Yates, candidate for DeKalb County Commission, was misleading in that too much individual credit for resolution of the Parkway seemed to be declared. Becky did not want us to be deceived by overinflated claims. Ultimate resolution involved the teamwork of several people and the candidate has not been active in CAUTION for about six years.

• A public safety update was given by "Sheriff Bob." There has been increased activity in the neighborhood, especially in the theft of bicycles and other outside things (lawn mowers are also in demand it seems.) One woman's bike was stolen at gun point. Please exercise caution and guard your belongings.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:15. As you can tell from these minutes, a tremendous amount of information is presented at our meetings. Whether new to the community or a seasoned veteran, please join us for future meetings at the Epworth Methodist Church the second Tuesday of each month.


