From The President...

Here's an update on some of the things going on in Candler Park:

- Last month I let you know that the plans to renovate the Olmstead Parks along Ponce de Leon Ave. included the removal of the playground equipment. Due to public outcry, these plans have been scrapped and the playground will eventually be expanded to include equipment that meets ADA standards.

- I received a letter from the City of Atlanta regarding the Special Public Interest zoning legislation (SPI) that CPNO has asked the City to pass in regards to the redevelopment of a small portion of the D.O.T. property in Candler Park. This zoning would control such things as front yard setbacks, location of driveways, height of house, etc. The purpose is to insure that any houses built will mesh with existing houses in the neighborhood. The letter states: "We expect to produce a first draft of the SPI-7 ordinance for CPNO's review by the end of this month. After your group and NPU-N have had an opportunity to review and comment on the draft, and after we have made any necessary revisions to it, we would like to ask Council-member Davis to introduce the ordinance for first reading. Thereafter, the ordinance must be formally reviewed by NPU-N, considered at a public hearing by the Zoning Review Board, acted upon by the City Council's Zoning Committee, and adopted by the full City Council. This process...ordinarily takes about three months after the legislation has been introduced." Whew!

- We will hear a request for a variance at the April meeting. The owners of 1270 Druid Place would like to change the side yard set-back on a non-conforming structure.

This dream can come true this summer with your support. The Candler Park Pool Association has contracted with the City of Atlanta to manage the neighborhood's pool. Our goal is to run a clean, safe facility that residents of Candler Park and surrounding neighborhoods will want to use.

We are seeking subscriptions from individuals to join the Pool this summer. Benefits include admission to the pool during general operating hours plus access to the pool for 18 1/2 evening hours open to subscribers only. We will also have a subscribers party and offer discount on membership to those participating in a subscriber workday.

General admission prices will remain the same and we will provide morning free swims and access to the pool for summer camps. We do not intend to deny access to the pool, but rather make neighborhood residents feel more welcome. Too many of us drive to Garden Hills or Venetian Pools to swim. Atlanta Walking Tours

Have you ever wanted to know more about In-town Atlanta neighborhoods? Looking for something different and new to do when relatives are visiting? Trying to find an interesting way to get some exercise? If so, the Atlanta Preservation Center Guided Walking Tours may be the answer. The following walks are available through December 1996:

Sweet Auburn/MLK District: Tour begins at 10:00 AM every Saturday in front of the APEX Museum at 135 Auburn Ave.

Druid Hills: Tours on Wednesdays and Saturdays starting at 11:00AM from the front of St. Johns Lutheran Church (corner of Ponce de Leon and Oakdale)

Inman Park: Tours on Thursdays and Sundays starting at 2:00PM from the Inman Park United Methodist Church (1015 Edgewood Ave).

Ansley Park: Tours on Thursday at noon and Sundays at 1:00PM, leaving from the plaza of the church at 1235 Peachtree Street.

Piedmont Park: Tours on Saturdays at 11:00AM leaving from the Visitor's Center at the park's 12th street entrance.

West End: Tours on second Sunday of each month at 2:00PM leaving from the Wren's Nest at 1050 Ralph D. Abernathy Blvd.

Historic Downtown: Tours on Fridays at noon and Sundays at 1:00PM, leaving from the Candler Building at 127 Peachtree Street.

Underground Atlanta: Tours on Saturdays at 3:00PM, leaving from Atlanta's Heritage Row, 55 Upper Alabama St.

Atlanta University Center: Tours on the third Saturday of each month at 2:00PM, leaving from the Herndon Home, 587 University Place.

All tours are free for Atlanta Preservation Center members, \$5 for adult non-members, \$4 for Seniors and \$3 for students. For more information, call the Center (876-2040).


