I hope everyone had a great Olympics, and I'm sure we'll all be swapping our personal stories for years to come. My favorite story of my experience is of the time I was "carjacked" by Belorussians on their way to their judo competition.

One of my duties during the Olympics (in which I was joined by two other Candler Parkers, Barrett Tyson of Candler Station and Peter Hauser of Oakdale) was to deliver *The Olympian* newspaper to locations in the Olympic Village. One morning I was by myself making deliveries when I was suddenly surrounded by several men with heavy Russian accents shouting "World Congress Center! World Congress Center!" and pointing at their watches. They explained to me that their driver had not shown up (which was probably a misunderstanding on their part. There were buses provided to get to competitions) and they were suppose to have been at the WCC an hour earlier for competition. He asked, pleaded and begged me to drive them. I momentarily thought that it wasn't something I should be doing, I'd be late for where I was suppose to be, etc. But then I thought of what I'd been told in the ACOG training session - take on problems as your own and don't pass the buck.

So, of course, I drove them to the competition and they luckily arrived in time. In the process, I was reminded of those guideposts of personal responsibility and would like to remind you that improvement in the neighborhood aren't going to happen unless more people take the personal initiative to help.

Calling all Friends of Freedom Park East

After more than 25 years of attending meetings, contributing money to legal action, electing responsive political leaders to office and being arrested for civil disobedience, there is a strong sense of ownership of Freedom Park East by our neighborhood.

At the September 9th meeting, CPNO will consider what continuing responsibility it wants to take for this park. Ed McBrayer of the PATH Foundation, which developed the path, will present to suggest what has been done with other paths, particularly in regards to litter maintenance. We will consider organizing a committee or task force to give leadership to our collective will.

In addition to maintenance, some neighborhood people have spoken of developing landscaping plan and working to implement it piece by piece. This could be done with individual or organizational contributions of specific landscaping materials. Others have spoken of making the sculpture work, done on a single event basis by Art Festival of Atlanta, a continuing rotating exhibit. Some are interested in beautifying the creek on the north end of Candler Park. Come to the meeting on September 9th or let someone know of your interest.

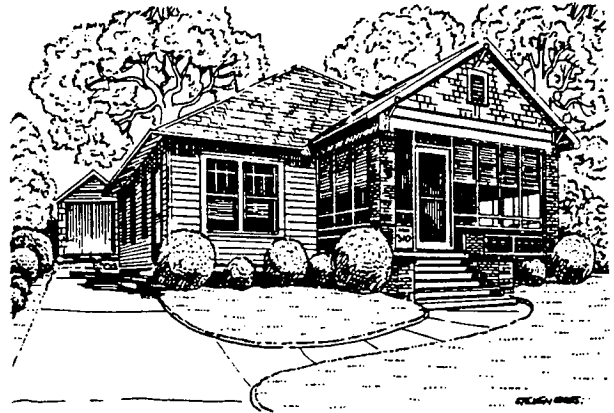
