From The President...

At this month's meeting there will be a vote on an amendment to the CPNO by-laws dealing with votes on zoning variances and other zoning matters. This amendment would allow for zoning matters to be voted on by the executive committee without having prior notice posted in the *Messenger* as is currently needed. The object of this amendment is to allow for Candler Park to voice an opinion on zoning matters that otherwise could not be delayed a month to allow for the *Messenger* posting. The possibility though is that affected neighbors would not be made aware in order to voice their opinions. This vote was originally intended to occur last month but was postponed to the November meeting.

The Zone 6 Station has moved it to its new home at 2025 Boulevard Dr. at the intersection of Kirkwood and Boulevard. Major Banda invites us to visit the new station, which is in need of interior decoration. So if you have any artwork to donate, please call Major Banda at 371-5002.

The big news this past month is the armed robberies in the neighborhood. At the last meeting, Patrolman Bud Watson informed us that the Candler Park Supermarket and My Dry Cleaners in Little Five Points were robbed at gunpoint around 6:00PM on consecutive nights in the middle of October. He said that one of the best detectives in the city is assigned to these cases, and a high priority has been placed on solving them. In addition, there have been a string of burglaries and car thefts in Candler Park and Lake Claire. Bud also reminded everyone not to respond to strangers who appear at the door asking for money because they are often casing the house. If you notice anything or anyone suspicious, CALL 911.

Bud also reminded us about the special patrol request forms that are available if you plan to leave town and want an extra patrol around your home. I'll bring some of these forms to the November meeting, or you can call Zone 6 to get them.

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Free Trees For Candler Park

One of the most appealing characteristics of Candler Park, like many intown neighborhoods, is the number of large shade trees around our homes. Huge oaks, maples, beeches and other species provide numerous and invaluable benefits for Candler Park residents not to mention birds and other small animals. Many of these giant trees have been in a state of decline over the past few years as the result of severe drought and other factors. Our yard alone has suffered the loss of six large Oaks in just fourteen years, including the loss of the very first White Oak that was the clinching factor in our decision to buy our home.

Candler Park residents, with the help of *Trees Atlanta*, can help provide shade and beautiful habitat for the future. *Trees Atlanta* has offered FREE trees for planting in our neighborhood. These trees, all native species, may be picked up this fall at a time and place to be determined. These are not just saplings but large trees in 10 gallon buckets. Two people are required to plant them. 
