## Neighbors To Request Route Change At MARTA Meeting

### Notice to the Passengers of MARTA Route 6-Emory and the Residents of Oakdale Road and North Avenue:

MARTA has received a request from residents of Oakdale Road and North Avenue to reroute bus service currently provided by Route 6-Emory along these streets.

A community meeting will be held on Thursday April 11, 2002 at 7:00 p.m. at the Epworth United Methodist Church located at 1561 McLendon Avenue, Atlanta, Georgia.

All residents and passengers that are in favor or against removing Route 6 from Oakdale Road and North Avenue between McLendon Avenue and Moreland Avenue, and rerouting service via McLendon Avenue and Moreland Avenue are encouraged to attend and voice their opinion.

### Notes from an Oakdale neighbor:

Many of you participated in the survey we distributed several weeks ago regarding issues with the #6 MARTA bus on Oakdale and North Ave. Concerns addressed in your responses included safety

(buses speeding, narrow streets, on-street parking, pedestrian traffic, etc), property damage (house shaking, cracked windows and foundations, etc), noise, and pollution.

As you know, we've been trying to get a community meeting scheduled with MARTA to address the possibility of rerouting the #6 bus off Oakdale Rd (North of McLendon) and North Avenue (East of Moreland), and MARTA has agreed. They will have a court recorder and a sign language interpreter present and will evaluate the options based on the community's response.

Also, please remember that while many of you do

support re- routing the bus, others do not. If you do come to the meeting to oppose rerouting, please come with some ideas to address the issues of safety, property damage, noise, and pollution — all of which impact our community. 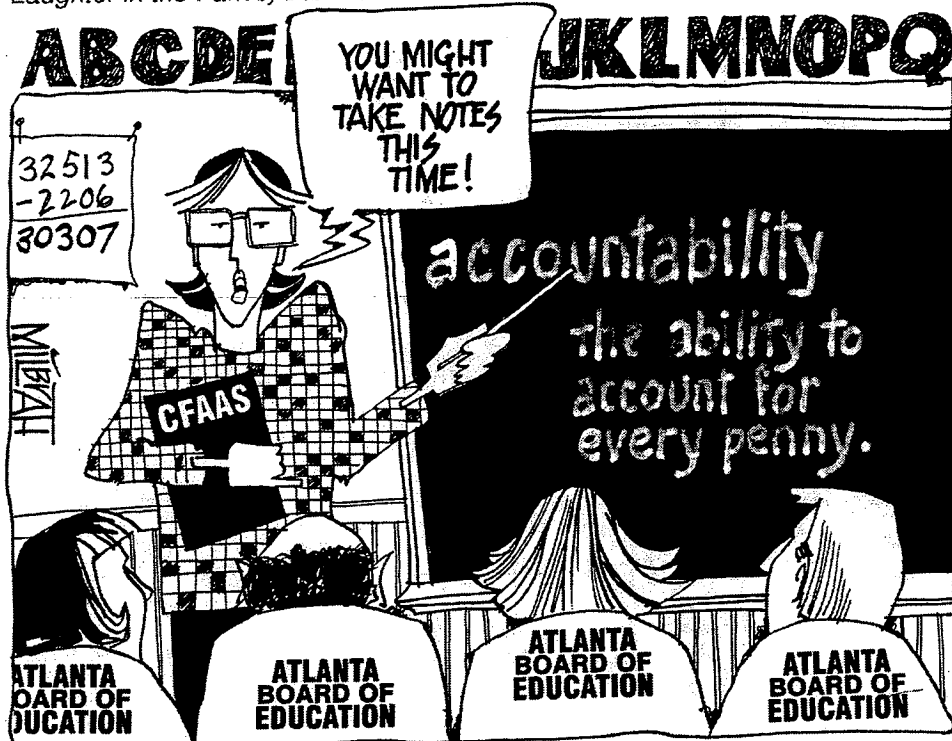

## Freedom Park Update: Coming Down The Home Stretch

As many of you have noticed, work on the section of Freedom Park within Candler Park is nearing completion. The Freedom Park Conservancy has led the effort to add landscaping, sidewalks, multi-use trails along Moreland Avenue, a connecting trail at the end of Candler Street, and a secondary trail along Druid Place. Outstanding items include benches for the rest area overlooking Goldsboro Park, a water fountain at the corner of North Avenue and Euclid Avenue, and connecting sidewalks along North Avenue, Druid Place, and Oakdale. This work should be completed by the end of April 2002.

While the Freedom Park Conservancy has worked hard to make this a reality, we could not have done so without the assistance of others. We would like to especially thank Dekalb County Commissioner Gayle Walldorff, City Council President Cathy Woolard, State Representative Stephanie Stuckey Benfield, Paideia School, the PATH foundation, and the Atlanta Track Club. We would also like to thank developers Robert Reed and Tony Tripoli for contributions they made.

I have received many questions about the "ponds" along North Avenue. These are part of a rain garden that was created to address erosion problems and to help reduce the stormwater run-off from the park. These heavily planted areas are designed to capture run-off from storms and allow the water to be absorbed into the soil. Because of this design there should not be standing water in these areas for more than 48 hours.

## Saturday, April 20 Is Candler Park Work Day!

Please join us at 10 am on Saturday, April 20 to clean up Candler Park. We will be dividing into teams and scouring the woods for trash. One team will also cut the kudzu out of the trees in the small ravine on McLendon near the entrance of the park. If there are specific park areas that

The Freedom Park Conservancy is working on several other projects including landscaping and trail work to the section of the park between Moreland and Highland Avenues. This project will add trails along existing lines and along the north side of Freedom Parkway. It will also add shade trees and establish turf in this section of the park. Additionally, the Freedom Park Conservancy will soon be making landscaping improvements to the section of the park between Boulevard and the Carter Center. All of this work should be complete by the end of spring 2002.

Lastly, the Freedom Park Conservancy is working to make changes along Moreland Avenue to help facilitate the co-existence of vehicular and pedestrian traffic. To this end we will be working with the Georgia Department of Transportation to rework the intersection of Freedom Parkway and Moreland Avenue and with MARTA to add a bus shelter and bus pull over at the intersection of North Avenue and Moreland Avenue. We hope to begin this work in the summer of 2002.

The Freedom Park Conservancy is an advocacy group for Freedom Park. It is composed of representatives from the neighborhoods surrounding the park and it is committed to the development and maintenance of Freedom Park. 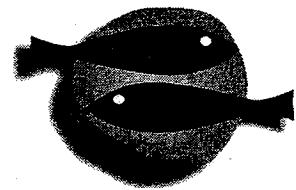

## Notice Of Proposed Revision To NPU-N By-Laws

The following NPU-N amendment will be discussed at the April CPNO meeting:

### VI. Officers

The officers of NPU-N shall consist of a Chairperson, a Vice-Chairperson and a Secretary. They shall be elected, by the Executive Committee, at the regular November meeting of NPU-N and their term of service shall be one year, beginning the first day of January and ending the last day of December of the year following their election. Nominations from the Executive Committee will be accepted during the election process. *It is required that nominees for the position of Vice-Chairperson and Secretary be sitting members of the current Committee.*

The position of Chairperson may be elected in a similar manner as a voting member of the Committee on all issues. The Executive Committee, may at its own discretion, elect a Chairperson who is not required to be a current member of the Executive Committee but is required to reside in the NPU-N district.

In this event the Chairperson will be declared a non-voting member of the Executive Committee with the exception that in the event of a tie vote of the Committee the Chairperson may cast the deciding vote.

These problems could include things like flooding, stormwater runoff, water pollution, and erosion; anything that affects the health of our watershed.

There will be a short presentation at this meeting and a date will be announced for upcoming joint neighborhood meetings as we proceed with the development of this PWA, *Watershed Management Plan*.

# Everyone Needs To Play At Mary Lin

The current Mary Lin playground will be removed by Atlanta Public Schools this June as part of a project to correct the drainage at the school site. While APS will pay for the removal and storage of the equipment, they cannot pay for the reinstallation.

The Mary Lin PTA has taken this as an opportunity for improvements to the playground to make it more accessible and safer for all children. The current equipment will be split into two play structures, one geared for older elementary and one geared for the younger children, and re-sited along the eastern side of the school's soccer field. This will allow teachers (and parents during non-school hours!) more flexibility for playground use. Additionally, changes will be made to the equipment to make it more accessible and fun for handicapped persons as well as bring it up to current ADA standards. One big part of this is the surfacing materials that will be used. The PTA is applying for a Nike Air to Earth grant that will provide money to purchase and install recycled rubber surfacing. Not only is the surfacing environmentally friendly, it is ideal for wheelchairs and requires much less

ongoing maintenance. A separate play area will be created on the northern side of the school's soccer field. This area will be used for more game oriented play such as tetherball. Finally, the PTA hopes to install an irrigation system for the soccer fields (APS, per policy, does not fund athletic fields at the elementary level). The school as well as Atlanta Soccer Association heavily uses these fields and a healthy grass surface will make them safer for all that use them!

The total cost of this project, approximately \$83,000, is a challenge but an achievable one! The PTA is pursuing corporate and foundation grants, donations from area businesses as well as donations for individuals and families in the community. Individual/family donations of \$75 (\$150 for businesses) will be honored by a brick paver incorporated into the walkway to the playground. Individual/Family donations of \$125 will be given two bricks! What a great way to make your child, or another child, feel like part of the school community!

The PTA hopes to secure the money in time to install the new playground in Fall 2002. Please consider making a donation

of any size to this project! The new playground will be an asset to the school as well as the community for years to come. The deadline to receive a brick with a donation is May 30<sup>th</sup>, although the sooner we raise the money the sooner we can install the playground!
