To borrow from Mark Twain... we're happy to say that reports of FallFest's demise have been greatly exaggerated! FallFest 2004 will go on, with only a slight change of plan: Rather than being held on the third weekend of October, FallFest will be held on the last weekend of the month, allowing us to add in lots of Halloween fun!

Behind The Scenes At City Hall

After filing our festival plan with City of Atlanta in July, we learned - too late - that a new ordinance had changed the way deadline dates are calculated making our application two days late according to the new ordinance. It appeared we would have to cancel.

When we announced our thoughts of cancellation at the August CPNO meeting, however, there was such a huge outcry of disappointment that we decided to go back to the City. The Special Events Department allowed us to change the date of FallFest retroactively, thus falling within the 90 day application period. A permit meeting was held at City Hall on August 27, and we were officially given the green light to have FallFest October 30-31.

You Asked For It - Can You Help?

Because of the uncertainty and date change, we're getting a later start and need more help than usual. There are plenty of things you could pitch in on that would require as little as 30 minutes, so please let us know if you

can be part of the team.

We also have three critical Coordinator jobs to fill, and we've got to fill them quickly:

Artist Liaison(s): Handles artist/booth questions and concerns. At least one liaison needs to be on-site when we "load in" on Friday October 29.

Volunteer Liaison: Recruits volunteers and schedules their shifts for the two festival days, then makes sure things run smoothly during the festival.

Canine Cotillion Coordinator: Love dogs and stupid dog tricks? This is the job for you. You make the arrangements for our Canine Cotillion dog show, including organizing and judging.



Manning water stations, directing traffic, helping at the finish line or cheering your neighbors and strangers through a strong or staggering effort.


There is also still space available to sponsor this years race.


The Tour Of Homes Is On!!

President Carter & Pianist Roger Williams to Celebrate 80th Birthdays

On October 1, 2004, renowned pianist Roger Williams will break his personal piano performance marathon record, entertaining visitors for 13 1/2 hours at the Jimmy Carter Presidential Library and Museum. The event will commemorate the 80th birthday of both President Carter and Mr. Williams.

"I am delighted that Roger has chosen to celebrate our birthday this way," said President Carter. "It will be a great opportunity for me and for people from across the country to hear some of America's favorite melodies performed by one of our nation's best loved musical artists."



Roger Williams is the greatest selling pianist in history, with 118 albums to his credit, 18 of them gold or platinum. His 1955 version of "Autumn Leaves" is the only piano instrumental to reach #1 on the Billboard singles chart and remains the best selling piano recording of all time. Having played for eight chief executives, he has earned the title "Pianist to the Presidents."

"While I have had the honor of performing for eight of our country's presidents, I never had the opportunity to play for President Carter when he was in the White House," says Williams. "It will be a special privilege to be able to celebrate our mutual

milestone birthdays and to perform for him at the Carter Library."

Former President Jimmy Carter and pianist Roger Williams both were born October 1, 1924. The former president was born in Plains, Georgia, and Mr. Williams was born in Omaha, Nebraska. Both served in the United States Navy, and each rose to the top of his chosen profession.

Williams' piano performance marathon will take place October 1, 2004, in the lobby of the Carter Presidential Library and Museum in Atlanta from 9:30 a.m. until 11:00 p.m. Admission to the concert is free.

These improvements had been delayed while the DOT and the City worked out the details but it appears everything is now in order.

Kashi Atl. Yoga And Meditation Center Opens in Candler Park

What's been going on at the old church on the corner of McLendon and Nelms? Kashi Atlanta has moved in!

Butterfly Garden For Freedom Park!

Before you start digging up your slingshots ready to go hunting some ole butterflies, read on.

There is a proposal for a Butterfly Garden to be installed in Freedom Park. The site chosen by participants is on North Ave. about 30 feet west of where it intersects with Candler Park Drive. It includes an old driveway with a low retaining wall which could be incorporated into the garden plan. The site would not interfere with park maintenance as it is inaccessible to mowers. It is close enough to the foot path to afford walkers an opportunity to view it.

The plan for the site is to include plants that are non-invasive and low maintenance in addition to being attractive to birds and butterflies. Plants are all Georgia natives and were approved by Kathy Gable of the Georgia Native Plant Society. Plants will be obtained through the Native Plant Society, the Master Gardener Program and possible corporate sponsorship and donations. Grants will be investigated. It is hoped that the garden can be educational to the community as well as sustaining to birds and butterflies as their habitat continues to decrease.

Schedule for garden:

1. Spray area in first week of September to control English Ivy, poison ivy, and incipient kudzu.
2. Spray again 2 weeks later to complete the job.
3. One more spray two weeks later if needed.
4. Aerial bombing after that if the damn weeds don't DIE!
5. Till and fill area with compost and manure, cover with polyurethane.
6. Plant in November.
7. Put up Bluebird boxes at later time.

LAND USE ISSUES

The following land use issues are scheduled to be heard and voted on at the September CPNO meeting. Land use issues to be voted on at the October meeting must be submitted prior to September 26.

1282 Druid Place - (V-04-218) - Shawn Purcell, owner of property at 1282 Druid Pl. (zoned R-4), located at the northwest corner of intersection with Candler St, seeks a variance to reduce the required half-depth front yard setback (along Candler St) from 17.5' (required) to 7.5' (proposed) to allow for a two-story addition to an existing single-family residence. Owner has advised that the proposed improvements will increase the "footprint" of the principal structure, but that the variance does not encroach further into the setback than the offset distance of the existing dwelling. This matter will be heard by NPU-N at 7PM on Thursday Sept. 23rd, and by Atlanta Board of Zoning Adjustment at 1PM on Friday Oct. 1st or Oct. 15th at City Hall in 2nd Floor Council Chambers, 55 Trinity St S.W., Atlanta.

NPU-N ISSUES

NPU-N meetings are held at 7PM, on the 4th Thursday of every month at Epworth Methodist Church. Candler Park residents are welcome to attend. Contact NPU-N representative Walt Weimar regarding any regularly-scheduled voting or agenda matters.

Ponce de Leon / Moreland Avenue Corridor Study - A kickoff meeting for the Ponce de Leon / Moreland Avenue Corridor Study, focusing on the Moreland Avenue corridor from Ponce to I-20 (the west boundary of Candler Park), the Edgewood/Candler Park MARTA station, and related transportation issues, is scheduled for 6:30 to 8 PM at City Hall East, 675 Ponce de Leon Avenue, 1st Floor Auditorium.

Ignored DeKalb Ave Properties - A municipal code enforcement official in attendance advised, when asked by CPNO regarding the condition of unoccupied commercial property in the 1300 block of DeKalb Avenue, that a compliance notice has been sent to the owner of record, who may be seeking to sell or redevelop the property. The official indicated that the Owner is working with his office to resolve issues regarding the appearance of the property, including apparent vandalism.

Olmsted Linear Park Alliance and Druid Hills Civic Association are now expected to move forward with plans to obtain Urban Design Commission approval of the plan approved by CPNO for relocation of the play area within Springdale Park on Ponce de Leon Avenue. Discussion of the boundless playground proposed along Clifton Terrace between Page and Terrace Avenues may continue, but will be unrelated to project design or requirements for the Springdale Park play area.

Little 5 Points Halloween Festival - including parade and costumed road race, is currently scheduled for Friday, October 22nd and Saturday, October 23rd.
